Favela Paintings

Domingos is famous for his large paintings of favelas that he brings to life with acrylics in bright, bold colours. Using a spatula, he applies the base before adding additional colours to define the facades of the houses. He uses thick black paint to pick out details and create a 3D effect. Although he diverges into other themes such as portraits, his most defining and popular work is his favela paintings.

Key Vocabulary

- Favela a Brazilian shack or shanty town; a slum
- Landscape all the visible features of an area of land,
- Canvas strong, coarse unbleached cloth made from hemp, flax, or a similar yarn.
- Acrylic Paint Acrylic paint is a fast-drying paint made of pigment suspended in acrylic polymer
- **Spatula** Sometimes called a scraper, any tool with a blade that is somewhat flexible, but fairly rigid. It is generally used for modelling such soft materials as clay, paint, plaster, and wax.
- Colour swatch -A palette showing a variety of shades of the same colour.
- Brush mark -Textural effect from the bristles of a paint brush.
- Tools a physical item to create art
- Technique The tools the artist has used so far
- **Purpose of paint** Thickness, oil/water based, ease of application, application using brush marks, high opacity, water resistant.
- Palette a thin board or slab which an artist lays and mixes colours
- **Repeat Image** When an image is used frequently throughout a piece of art work.
