### Changes in Early Britain

#### What should I already know?

- Birkenhead Priory is the oldest standing building on Merseyside it was founded in 1150 as a Benedictine monastery
- The first passenger ferry across the Mersey was in 1864
  - The Woodside terminal was updated in 1985
    - William Hesketh Lever lived 1854-1916
- Lever Brothers factory opened in Port Sunlight in 1885
  - Port Sunlight Village was founded in 1888
- Prince Charles founded the town of Poundbury in 1993
- Yuri Gagarin was the first human to orbit the earth in 1961
  - Neil Armstrong was the first man on the moon in 1969
- Tim Peak was the first British man to walk in space in 2015
