- Who were the last 10 presidents of the United States with dates
- Who were the last 5 presidents of Russia with dates
- The Blitz on Birkenhead and the bombing of our Parish church
- Who was Winston Churchill? Stalin? Franklin? Roosevelt? JFK? Hitler?
- What happened in Britain after the end of WW2 to 1970?
- Which are the most popular meals today in USA, Russia and Britain?

Do

- Watch some of the following films: A league of their own, The book thief, How the Beatles changed the world (Netflix), Anastasia (Disney), National Treasure (Disney), Goodnight Mister Tom, Mission Impossible 2, Valiant (animated).
- Watch Horrible Histories (related to areas being studied).
